Please check your child's folder daily for any school news, notices or incident reports. These folders will be located in rooms 5, 6 and 7.

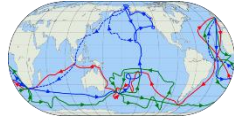
What's happening?

Water Adventures

Nothing beats the Texas heat on a summer day then a cool dip in the pool. Students will have the opportunity for “free swim” in the Towne Creek Pool twice a week. Safety rules of the pool will be discussed and lifeguards will always be on duty when children are present. **Campers should come dressed with their swim suit under their clothes and with sunscreen already applied (due to licensing regulations no aerosol cans are allowed in the building. Please send lotion or pump only for reapplying).** Swimmers will need a towel, a hat (if you wish), **water shoes**, a complete change of clothes for after swim, and a bag for their wet clothes. All wet clothes must go home at the end of the day. **Please make sure everything is labeled.** Those students participating in swim lessons will need a second suit and towel. **Please wear water shoes on Free Swim and Splash Days. Please, please, please label all items with your child’s initials.**

Journaling

Each child will have the opportunity during the summer to draw pictures and write about our fun-filled days in their journals.



Reading

Pre-K will participate in the Fort Bend County Library Program. We will read the books at school (or have the books read to the children) and your child will receive a trophy when the class has read 20 books.

Besides all of the classroom activities, field trips and water activities mentioned above, we will take advantage of all of the Towne Creek amenities. Whether spending time on the computer, bouncing balls on the parachute in the gym, playing games on the field or just playing with friends, we plan on this being an unforgettable summer adventure for your child.

HERE ARE SOME GENERAL GUIDELINES AND REMINDERS FOR THE SUMMER PROGRAM.

Please notify the school and your child's teacher if:

- your child is going to be absent.
- your child has any type of allergies or special needs.

Each child must have a change of clothes including underwear and a pair of shoes in a zip lock bag in their backpack or cubby. **Please label all personal items.**

Check your child's classroom door for information regarding upcoming events.

Apply sunscreen before coming to school; teachers can re-apply during the day as needed. **Label sunscreen with your child's name. (Only lotion and pumps due to licensing)**

It is recommended that children wear tennis shoes for their safety and comfort. Sandals and flip flops make running and climbing difficult for children and should only be worn for water activities.

If your child has a birthday he/she is welcome to celebrate it with his/her friends at Towne Creek. Please check with your child's teacher about the best time to bring a birthday treat. All food must be store bought and be labeled with the ingredients used to make it. We must be sensitive to the food allergies present in the classroom.

Drop off and Pick Up

All children must be accompanied into the building by an adult (18 years or older) and signed in. The sign in/out clip boards are located on the hook outside the classroom door. Student names are listed alphabetically by last name. Locate your child's name and write the time of drop off and your initials. You will follow this same procedure when you pick up your child at the end of the day.
